



Reading Program Overview



What is it?

- The USPBL reading program is an incentive based program that is designed to encourage students to read more. Administrators will create reading goals during the reading month of March and assist their students to obtain these goals. When the students crush their goals, they will be rewarded with a free ticket to a USPBL baseball game! Administrators will also receive a free ticket for helping their students meet their goals, and parents/guardians will receive discounted ticket options!

What are the goals and how do we track them?

- Goals are determined by the administration and what they feel is the best fit for their students. Some goals that have been used in the past are:
 - X amount of minutes of reading per night
 - X amount of minutes of reading throughout the month
 - X amount of pages of reading per night
 - Finish a book, or a few books, throughout the month

Schools are not required to report their goals to us, but if you would like assistance with coming up with goals then we would be happy to help!

- Tracking your students' progress is similar to goal setting. Schools can determine what they feel is best for tracking. Schools are not required to report progress of their students, and if you would like help creating a tracking system then we would be happy to help!

How are tickets distributed?

- Tickets will be disbursed at the completion of the reading program. During the month of March, detailed instructions will be sent to each school on how to receive the tickets. We will be asking for an excel sheet with the students' names in classroom order, with their teacher's name listed first.
